Why?



- The first Finnish satellites made Finland a space-faring nation

 and a launching state
- Finland is a party to the UN space treaties
 - →must authorize and supervise national space activities
 - →is responsible for national space activities and internationally liable for damages
- Objective: a predictable and legally transparent environment for national space activities
 - competitiveness of the sector
- Positive approach: no need to restrict space activities if the safety and quality of the activities can be ensured
 - Flexibility, low bureaucracy, active discussion with the operators

What does this mean to an operator?

Apply for authorization



Space activities in Finland or by a Finnish operator are subject to authorization by the Ministry of Economic Affairs and Employment

- Apply 6 months before launch BUT do contact the Ministry already in advance for discussion
- In the application describe:
 - Technical details of the activity and the resources of the operator
 - Assessment of the risks of the activity in all phases (from launch to orbit) and in all places (Earth, airspace, outer space)
 - Purpose of the space activity, incl. use of data
 - Measures to avoid space debris
 - ITU-licences, export control licences

Note the liability rules and get an insurance if required



The operator is liable for damages caused by its space object = state's right of recourse

THIRD PARTY LIABILITY INSURANCE REQUIRED:

- Always for the launch (until the space object reaches its orbit)
 - Either by the launch provider (as usually the case) or by the operator itself
- On orbit if
 - The risk for collision with other space object is > 1/1000
- After orbit if
 - The probability for the returning space object reaching the Earth is > 1 / 10 000

Obey other obligations



- Avoid space debris
- Ensure the safety of your space activities
- Register your space object in national and UN register
- Apply for an authorization before transferring space activities to another operator
- Inform the Ministry of relevant changes to the space activities
- Report annually to the Ministry of the status of the space activities
- Do not remove a fallen space object without permission!
